My dear Mr. Bloomfield:

As you know, I have been trying to find some place in Central Europe where I could offer you a place in the Diplomatic Service of the United States. I had hoped that something would develop that would make this possible long before this time, but either there have been no vacancies or when they have occurred it has been necessary to take some one already in the service of the United States. I feel that you would be very successful in this field, and, if in the future you are willing to undertake such service, I trust you will make your willingness known through your Senators, who would be glad to endorse you. If it so happens that you are not now a resident of Massachusetts, then I think you should apply to Senator Gillett on the one hand, and to the Republican organization in New York on the other.
